ine vinite's turnishings which are in the dining room:

- The dining room furniture.
- 2. The wool carpet.
- Marble statuary "Tennyson's Princess" by William Cooper ari Am, sculptor.

Of special interest are:

 The stained glass windows on the north wall which were installed when the house was constructed.

THE KITCHEN

The Museum kitchen was originally a bedroom where Mr. & Mrs. White slept in the winter months.

Of special interest are:

- 1. The stove which was powered with either wood or gas, patent 1922.
- 2. Ice box and ice card, circa 1900.
- 3. Stocked pantry.
- 4. Carpet sweeper.
- Ornate water heater.

THE LIBRARY

The library was comparable to the family room today, it was the room where the family spent their evenings together.

The White's furnishings which are in the library:

- 1. The Mission style furniture made by Stickley.
- 2. The wool carpet.
- 3. Green velvet drapes.
- The wood carvings which originally came from the J.J. Hagerman estate.
- 5. The wall safe above the fire place.

SPS COMPANY EXHIBIT

Upstairs to the extreme left, past the back landing was Mrs. White's sewing room. The exhibit depicts a wide range of early electrical appliances.

FASHION EXHIBIT

Fashion and music from the early 1900's to the 1950's are exhibited in this room. Also showcased are items from the turn-of-the-century and early musical instruments.

THE TOY ROOM

Originally a bedroom, this room displays toys and other sports equipment of the Victorian era, a school display and a sewing display.

THE WORLD WARS EXHIBIT

This room is filled with uniforms, pictures and other memorabilia from the two world wars.

UPSTAIRS FRONT LANDING

The large landing upstairs was used as a sitting room for reading or sewing.

THE BED CHAMBER

This bedroom was used as a guest room.

The White's furnishings which are in the bed chamber:

- 1. Photograph of Mrs. White's mother in oval frame.
- 2. Floor lamp with fringed shade.
- 3. Carpet.

Of special interest:

- 1. Sleigh feather bed, circa 1890.
- Transom above the door which was used for ventilation.

THE BATHROOM

The fixtures in this bathroom are original except the toilet bowl.

Of special interest:

The medicine cabinet (originally a door into the hall) depicts the period "remedies for aches and pains".

THE PEOPLE ROOM

This room, which was originally Zoa White's bedroom, contains pictures and memorabilia from some of Roswell's famous and infamous. Featured is a Mariachi display which was donated by musician Izzy Gutierrez. There are also photos of old Roswell and turn-of-the-century greeting cards and post cards
